Burglars Target Unlocked Homes

Police in the Peel Metropolitan Police District have identified an increase in the number of burglaries committed on residential premises through unlocked doors and windows.

During the four week period from June 1 to June 29, 2011 there were 298 burglary offences reported within the Police District which includes the City of Rockingham, City of Mandurah, Town of Kwinana, Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale and Shire of Murray.

76 of these offences were committed at commercial premises while 222 targeted homes. In 114 cases entry was gained to a home by forcing or smashing a door or window and in 89 cases entry was gained through unlocked doors and windows. In 29 cases motor vehicles were stolen during the burglary.

Garage doors are a common target for burglars with 20 instances of entry through an unlocked garage door being reported along with nine cases of forced entry through garage doors.

Police urge residents to keep their premises locked at all times even when they are home and to pay special attention to securing their garage doors.

Rockingham Wins Again!

Rockingham Beach has again won in Australia's Cleanest Beach Awards run by the Keep Australia Beautiful Council. This is a terrific achievement and something that we should strive towards for Singleton.

The award is judged on not only how clean the beach is but how the community is involved in keeping it this way and thereby protecting the coastal environment. Rockingham Beach has won the Water Conservation and Heritage & Culture category awards in the Keep Australia Beautiful, Australian Clean Beaches Awards 2010/11.

According to the Australian Clean Beaches National Judge, Dr David Moy,

"Rockingham Beach is fortunate to have many local environmental and community groups, schools, businesses and individual residents, willing to spend time and money in the protection of the coastal environment with strong support from the City of Rockingham.

"Minimisation of water use is a priority in the area with all facilities having water saving fittings or automatic cut off valves to ensure that water wastage is minimised. These water conservation efforts, including the use of bore water only as the standard throughout the foreshores, earned Rockingham Beach national recognition.

"There is also a strong focus in the region on celebrating cultural events and the extensive military and naval history," Dr David Moy added.

Through the Australian Clean Beaches Awards, Keep Australia Beautiful is able to recognise local community and individual efforts that are helping rural and regional communities to become environmentally, economically and socially sustainable.

GOLDEN BAY DEVELOPMENT

The City of Rockingham is now advertising its proposals for the Golden Bay Development, including the Proposed Structure Plan (2,200 residential units at a density of 5 to 80 dwellings per hectare) and the Proposed Foreshore Management Plan.

80 dwellings per hectare translates to many small houses packed in tightly, allowing

little sunlight in. The plan is also short of open public spaces for children to play.

Cyber Safety

Management of student use of communications technology is receiving a lot of media attention, particularly with the work being done by Psychologists such as Michael Carr-Gregg in the headlines.

It is an issue that has the potential to seriously impact on the lives of adolescents, whose self-image can be quite fragile during the upper primary and teenage years. Every so often this School experiences an incident where this technology has been mis-used, and a student becomes a victim. The only means of combating this is by teachers and parents working with students on strategies for the appropriate use of this technology. One thing Carr-Gregg emphasises is for the need for parents to closely monitor the use of computers and mobile phones in the home.

This can only be supported by saying if you allow your Primary-aged children to use facilities such as Facebook or MSN without close supervision, you are opening Pandora's Box. The School Principal is always ready to speak with any parent who has concerns about this, but if you want to adequately equip yourself with all of the relevant information, Google Michael Carr-Gregg.

Over the past two weeks, students have participated in the Comet Bay School Sports Association's Cross-Country Carnival and the State Cross-Country Championships. Congratulations to all who participated and represented the School with such pride and sportsmanship.

Climate Change

Climate change impacts are more than just coastal impacts resulting from rising sea levels and increased storm events; it also includes matters such as health issues associated with increased higher temperatures.

The following major potential impacts have been identified:-

- Reduced water availability for watering park areas;
- Reduced water available for natural wetlands;
- Increased potential for bush fires, impacting on public safety, ecosystems and public administration;
- Impacts on public health (heat stress, increased mosquito activity etc);
- Inundation of low lying areas, impacting on ecosystems and infrastructure; and
- Damage to infrastructure and environment resulting from increased severity and frequency of storm events.

Community BBQ Project

Throughout April, 16 Community BBQs were officially implemented as part of the Rockingham Community BBQ Project. An estimated 950 residents participated in the project from 7 Suburbs throughout Rockingham, including our one in Singleton.

Mosquitoes

I recently had a meeting with the representatives from the City of Mandurah and the Shires of Waroona and Murray regarding the Mosquito problem that was experienced this year. As it is treated as a health issue and not a nuisance issue funding from the State is limited. However due to this year's prevalent nuisance all the local authorities are looking at a strategy to try to combat the problem next year.

Golden Bay Development

Advertising of the proposed Structure Plan for Golden Bay commenced Friday, 1st July. In conjunction, the following proposals are also being advertised:

- Foreshore Management Plan for the adjoining foreshore area:

- Amendment to Planning Policy 6.3
- Local Commercial Strategy; proposing to increase the maximum shop/retail floorspace for the Golden Bay East Neighbourhood Centre from 2,800m² to 3,540m².

- Amendment to Town Planning Scheme No. 2 - Amendment No.106: proposing to remove the Residential Density Codes from the Scheme Map over the Golden Bay Development Area.

Letters have been sent to more than 2,500 owners and occupiers in the area inviting comment on the proposals. General notification of the proposal will also be undertaken by the placement of signage on-site, the placement of advertisements in the Weekend Courier, and the provision of detailed information on the City's website.

Advertising will extend for over 6 weeks, concluding on the 15th August 2011.

Observations on Singleton Life

As we walk the streets delivering our Singleton Newsletter, it is evident that many new families are moving into Singleton. We welcome them to our community. Amid the doom and gloom in the outside world, Singleton is clearly recognised as a great place to live. Obvious attractions are sun, sea and surf, but there are other interesting aspects to our community.

The Southern Brown Bandicoot (*Isodon obesulus*) is an interesting little character who was recognised as an endangered species. A 1992 EPA report estimated that only 10 to 15 individuals lived in Singleton and were unlikely to survive. We are happy to report that, 19 years later, a bandicoot was recently seen crossing the entrance to the Bight Reefs Road Car Park. They are very timid, with good reason. Fast cars and cats are their

greatest threats. So, please, lock up your pussy cats and crazy drivers.

An aged and endangered community of *Homo sapiens* has also resided in Singleton for many years. In the past, several of them worked tirelessly for the community. They do become stressed by such things as loud outdoor music, screaming car and motorbike engines and other sorts of anti-social behaviour. This makes them growl something that sounds like "ugeroff, ugeroff"! When treated with neighbourly consideration, they are generally very friendly.

The anonymous walkers that keep our streets tidy (*Homo tidyuperus*) are another rarely seen group. They quietly dispose of containers that have been tossed out of car windows. They work quietly and without recognition. We thank them



and encourage others to follow their example.

Singleton natives are a friendly and caring bunch. They form small informal communities that care for their area of interest and occasionally come together for a common cause. Most have a common interest in promoting a caring and considerate community. We encourage newcomers to join the sporting, educational, and community groups and continue the task of making Singleton a great place to live.

Fungi – more than mushrooms

It's fungi time! These amazing organisms are often overlooked when we talk about contributions to ecosystem processes. However they are vital for sustaining landscape processes in Australia due to its infertile soils.

Fungi assist in nutrient cycling, maintaining soil structure and reducing erosion, they are great decomposers of litter and debris and are a valuable food source for our native animals. The great diversity of fungi in Australia sustain Eucalypt forests and woodlands in contrast to other places in the world with a similar environment which

support only shrubby vegetation.

There's always a lot of fungi activity at this time of the year because they are visible for such a short period of time and there is such a range of colour, size and form. 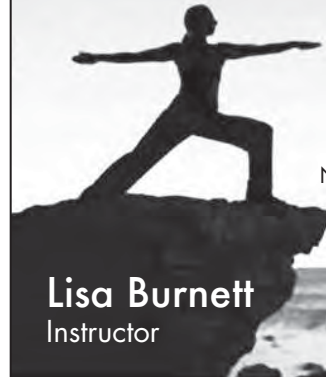

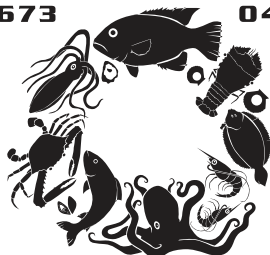

CAN YOU HELP? Singleton Primary School P&C in need of an Auditor

The Singleton Primary School P&C are currently looking for an Auditor to fill this recently vacated position. For a number of years a retired Mandurah Accountant has done our audit for a nominal fee. Unfortunately due to declining health, he can no longer fill this position. We are hoping that we can secure the services of someone again for a nominal fee so that all our fundraising revenue can be applied for the benefit of the school children.

Our P&C Constitution states that we appoint an Honorary Auditor or Auditors (preferably persons holding

appropriate qualifications) but does not state that they must be qualified. It is up to the P&C to decide if the auditor's qualifications and/or experience are sufficient for the job.

Per our governing body, WACSSO, some P&Cs have indicated that they have used retired bank officers (or bank managers), school registrars, bookkeepers, accountants, officers from the local council and the local senior citizens (often they are retired bookkeepers, accountants etc).

If anyone in the community think that they may be able to provide their

services we would be delighted to hear from them and can give them an estimate of how long the audit would take (about a day) and the volume of our transactions. The WACSSO website gives samples of required reports and auditor letters.

The timing of the audit would be about Jan/Feb to be completed for our AGM held in March of each year.

In this column, I'll be continuing on the theme of raising responsible teens from last month's issue and expanding further on the six ingredients for raising responsible teens. As discussed previously those ingredients are:

- Taking part in family decision making
- Being respectful and considerate
- Being involved in family activities
- Developing a healthy lifestyle
- Being reliable
- Being assertive.

This week we are looking at the second three things on that list;

Developing a Healthy Lifestyle

Habits formed when we're children and teenagers often stay with us as adults, and these can affect our personal relationships and health.

- Decide what you expect of your teen. This might relate to diet, exercise, showering, washing clothes or keeping their room clean.
- Find out what other parents expect of their teen's lifestyle.
- Once you've decided, model these behaviours yourself. Your teen is more likely to eat well, exercise etc if they see you and other family members doing these things.

Being Reliable

Reliability is an important ingredient in building good relationships in all areas

of life. It helps others have trust and confidence in us. Teenagers who are reliable and can be trusted:

- Do what they say they will do
- Are where they say they will be
- Spend time with people they say they will be with
- Come home at the agreed time
- Contact parents if plans change

As a parent, we are more likely to see reliability in our teenagers if we are reliable ourselves. This is especially important in our interactions with our teenagers. Otherwise, the reaction is likely to be "You didn't do what you said you'd do, so why should I?"

Being Assertive

Being assertive is somewhere between being timid and being aggressive. It means not being pushed around, or pushing others around-verbally or physically. Assertive people are confident about their views, their wishes and their needs, and are able to express them calmly and firmly. They are able to ensure that their rights are not ignored or abused, and to discuss differing views and opinions without creating conflict and hostility. They also know when to be flexible and give a little.

Points to Remember

Do not get too upset if your teenager makes mistakes as they struggle to become independent and take on adult responsibilities. You might think back

to how it was for you when you were that age. Most teenagers eventually leave home and lead independent lives and maintain healthy links with their parents.

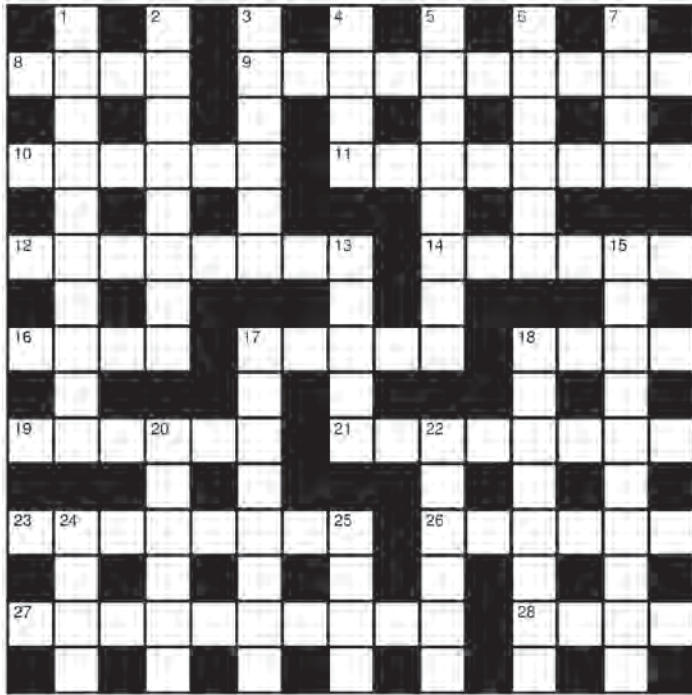
If you are parenting your teenager with a partner:

- See if you and your partner can agree on what behaviour you want to promote in your teenager - perhaps set a goal together that will help improve how family members get on with each other
- Model the behaviour that you want to see in your teenager as often as you can - specially around your teenager.
- Back each other up when you have to deal with an issue that involves your teenager's behaviour at home - talk about it later in private if you disagree.
- Discuss family matters that need to be addressed with your partner and where appropriate with your teenager.

If you are parenting without a partner, try and find support from your social network. It can be helpful to talk to another parent of a teenager to get a second opinion about how you are handling things at home.

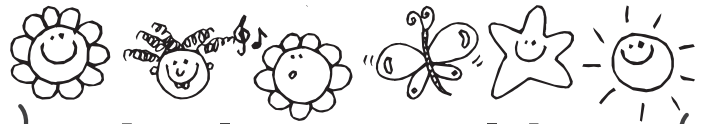
